Utility Laborer
Wastewater Treatment Plant

The Utility Laborer Position is under the direction of an immediate supervisor. Employees of this classification perform work of a specialized nature, involving skills and knowledge which can be acquired on the job. The worker will be assigned various tasks, maintenance and preventative in nature, for the daily upkeep and maintenance of the wastewater treatment plant. The employee must follow safety regulations and procedures specific to each crew's work situation. Upon receipt of oral and written instructions from the immediate supervisor, the worker completes assigned tasks.

Essential job functions include but are not limited to:

Performing a variety of routine maintenance and servicing operations for the City's wastewater treatment plant. They will also be required to perform a variety of routine maintenance and servicing operations from weed-eating grounds to taking flow measurements of various manholes in the collection system. They will also need to be able to move and set up various pumps on and off site, organize storage and keep track of inventory levels of materials and other various duties as assigned.

NOTE:

Overtime work may be required on an as-needed basis and may require working nights, weekends, and holidays.

Will be on an on call rotation and will be required to work some weekends and holidays.

Treatment Plant Position can be a second shift position. (3pm-12am)

A Class D CDL license is required

An OK State DEQ water and wastewater D license will be required within 1 year of employment.

Working Conditions can include, but not limited to:

Outside; continually exposed to heat, cold, humidity, rain, etc.

Working on or around slippery surfaces such as wet streets, manholes, stairwells, walkways, etc.

Subject to working in manholes below ground level. Intermittent working in confined, cramped and awkward positions when performing maintenance and repair tasks.

Working near moving objects such as traffic and equipment. Exposed to pronounced strains or vibrations, high concentrations of dust, and intermittent or continued loud and insistent noises when operating equipment.

Exposed to allergy-causing agents such as bee or wasp stings, poison oak, ivy and sumac. Subject to working near electrical hazards.

Subject to constant contact with water and or wastewater at work site.

Exposure to chemical irritant such as acid and other chemicals.

Subject to working near large concentration of noxious odors.
